

# PATROL LEVEL DETERMINATION

There are three (3) Levels in our Camporee. The three levels are:

- New Patrols**      These patrols are made up of mostly new scouts with little experience in the scouting skills. The activities for these boys will focus mostly on the basics that the Webelos scouts know when they enter Boy Scouts.
- Experienced**      These patrols have boys that can be from a wide range of ranks. There are boys in these patrols that know the basic skill and are working on making those skills better. Although these patrols are not advanced, they can work together to accomplish difficult tasks
- Scouts in Action**      These patrols are made up of scouts that have been teaching the scout skills and can know demonstrate their skills in real-life scenarios without direction from leaders.

To determine the Level a patrol falls in, use the following rating system:

Rank	Points
Scout	1.0
Tenderfoot	2.0
Second Class	3.0
First Class	4.0
Star	5.0
Life	6.0
Eagle	7.0

<b>Level breakdown:</b>	
New Patrol: 1.0-3.0	(White Scorecards)
Experienced: 3.1-5.5	(Blue Scorecards)
Advanced: 5.6 and up	(Red Scorecards)

Add up the points of each scout and divide by the number of scouts in the patrol, this will equal the rating for that patrol. Do this for each patrol participating from your troop.

## EXAMPLE:

Scouts	Rank	Points
1	Star	5
2	Life	6
3	2 <sup>nd</sup> Class	3
4	Star	5
5	2 <sup>nd</sup> Class	3
6	Star	5
7	1 <sup>st</sup> Class	4
8	Star	5
Total Points		41

<b>Patrol Example:</b>
Take the total points (41) and divide by the number of scouts in the patrol (8). The result is 5.125. This would make this patrol in the Experienced Level.
The Patrol's Scoutmaster might want to raise the level of this patrol because of how high the score is.

The activities are designed for a patrol of 6 to 8 boys. Smaller, or larger, patrols will be allowed, but ALL patrols will be judged the same. Participation is a significant portion of the patrol's score. It is the discretion of the Scoutmaster to:

- Combine smaller patrols to create a 6 to 8 boy patrol,
- Allow a smaller patrol to compete, or
- Split larger patrols

# PATROL METHOD

One of the prime purposes of the Camporee is to utilize the patrol method during the entire events. Activities are planned to exemplify the patrol method within the troop and to show true scout spirit throughout the Camporee. Patrols should look, camp, and compete as a patrol. Troop and patrol campsites must be identified. Plan ahead for the type of equipment you need for the Camporee. Events are planned for a patrol of 6 to 8. If a patrol is smaller than 8, to complete an event, a patrol member may need to do part of an event more than once. For example: patrols as small as 4 will be able to compete in all events, but will be required to compete as a patrol of 8. That means scouts may need to do the event more than once.

**Leaders, and parents will not be allowed to help. The scouts are on their own!**

**If the evaluator of an event feels that an adult is assisting the patrol, a score of ZERO “0” can be awarded to the patrol at that event.**

Cheering and taking pictures is encouraged to make the camporee a fun and exciting experience for every scout, but do it in the spirit of good scouting.
